Message for Year 6 parents from Arriva



Dear Parents & Guardians

Now the time is approaching for your child to move onto their new school have you considered that they catch a bus to school?

If so, Arriva would like to take this opportunity to inform you about our Child Saver tickets.

For less than £1.50 a day your child can have unlimited access to travel on any of our buses across all Arriva routes in Shropshire and the West Midlands. What's more, this not only cover their journeys to and from school. For no additional charge they'll be able use the same ticket to travel during the evenings, weekends and all throughout the school holidays.

The cost of this ticket can be spread over affordable monthly payments, using our easy Direct Debit system. This makes it an ideal way to get reduced bus travel without having to pay upfront. It's a simple process to apply and there's no set up fee, or minimum contract. Which means, if your circumstances change you can just cancel your direct debit & stop your ticket.

Once registered Arriva will send a bus pass to you by post, or if you prefer you can choose to have an m-ticket sent directly to your child's mobile phone. The ticket will automatically be renewed every month as long as your direct debit remains active.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all the staff who are leaving for their hard work and commitment during their time at Dothill.

Dinner Money Arrears

As you know, we operate a zero tolerance on meal arrears as some quite substantial overspends have built up on some of the children's accounts in previous years.

On the first day that children choose a lunch and have no credit on their account, our kitchen team will let them have their meal, thus leaving an arrears of £2.20. The parent/ carer will get a letter from the cook informing them of the debt so they are aware and can rectify the situation straight away. They should also get an email from the cook warning of a low balance. If the arrears are not cleared, and if the children do not bring in a packed lunch from home, the kitchen team will give them an emergency meal (a cheese sandwich and a piece of fruit) at lunchtime if they come for a school meal. This will be chargeable.

In the past, parents/carers have also been rung by the office if their child's account is in debt and the child has ordered a dinner that day. In the future, this will not happen if your child's account is in debt. In that case, your child will automatically get an emergency meal (cheese sandwich and fruit).

It is important that parents/carers update the school with any changes to their main email account as that is how the kitchen send reminders out re: low credit etc.

Thank you for your support and cooperation with this matter.

Enhancing Security

In order to ensure the safety of children and staff we have taken the decision to keep the front door of school closed. This will mean that parents/carers visiting school through the school day will need to ring the bell by the front entrance door and admin staff will assist them.

School is able to receive 60% of this amount in books which is just fantastic!


