News and Highlights this Week

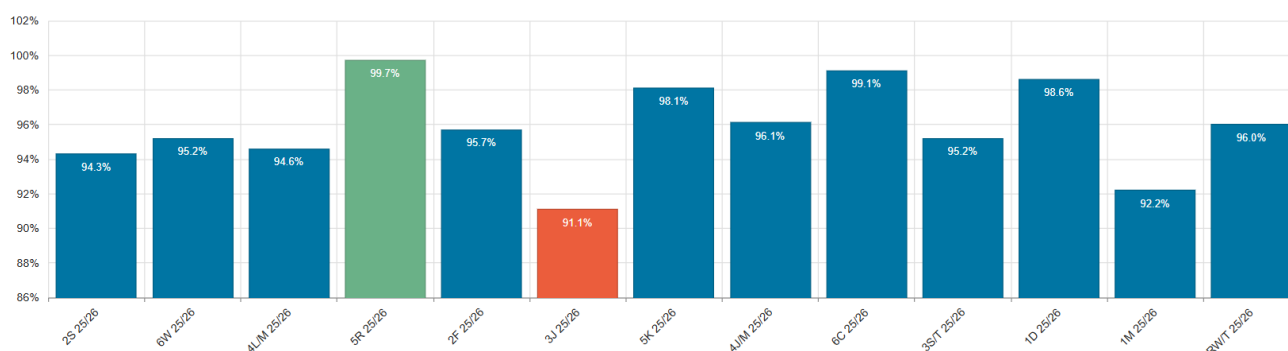

Online Safety Reminder

We have been made aware that some children are using social media apps such as TikTok and WhatsApp, so we'd like to gently remind families that these platforms have age restrictions (usually 13+) for safety reasons. In addition, we are aware that some children still access YouTube. Please take a moment to check the apps your child is using and have a conversation with them about staying safe online. It is important that adults monitor social media use very carefully and report concerns where necessary. As always, if you would like any advice or support around online safety, please do let us know. See below in the Online Safety section for more detail.

Warnings and Sanctions

Our school will make use of the full range of potential sanctions – including, but not limited to, those listed below – to tackle poor attendance. Decisions will be made on an individual, case-by-case basis.

Penalty Notices

The headteacher, local authority or the police can fine parents for the unauthorised absence of their child from school, where the child is of compulsory school age, by issuing a penalty notice.

If the school issues a penalty notice, it will check with the local authority before doing so and send it a copy of any penalty notice issued.

Before issuing a penalty notice, the school will consider the individual case, including:

- Whether the national threshold for considering a penalty notice has been met (10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a rolling period of 10 school weeks)
- Whether a penalty notice is the best available tool to improve attendance for that pupil
- Whether further support, a notice to improve or another legal intervention would be a more appropriate solution
- Whether any obligations that the school has under the Equality Act 2010 make issuing a penalty notice inappropriate
- Whether a parent has purposefully tried to avoid a Penalty Notice by taking their child out of school when there is only four pupil days in school and the fifth day is for example a PD day or bank holiday attached to that week.

A penalty notice may also be issued where parents allow their child to be present in a public place during school hours without reasonable justification, during the first 5 days of a suspension or exclusion (where the school has notified the parents that the pupil must not be present in a public place on that day).

Each parent who is liable for the pupil's offence(s) can be issued with a penalty notice, but this will usually only be the parent/parents who allowed the absence.

The payment must be made directly to the local authority, regardless of who issues the notice. If the payment has not been made after 28 days, the local authority can decide whether to prosecute or withdraw the notice.

If issued with a **first** penalty notice, the parent must pay £80 within 21 days, or £160 within 28 days.

If a **second** penalty notice is issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil, the parent must pay £160 if paid within 28 days.

A **third** penalty notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of the issue of the first penalty notice. In a case where the national threshold is met for a third time within those 3 years, alternative action will be taken instead.

EYFS

Creativity Counts in EYFS – Our 5 by 5 Focus

As part of the Telford & Wrekin 5 by 5 campaign, we are continuing to support children to develop important life skills. Creativity is a big part of this.

In EYFS, creativity isn't just about painting pictures. It's about children:

- Exploring their own ideas
- Using their imagination
- Solving problems in different ways
- Expressing how they feel through play, movement, art and talk

You might see your child:

- Building a "rocket" from boxes
- Making up songs, stories or dances
- Mixing colours, textures or materials
- Acting out real-life experiences in role play

All these creative experiences help children to develop confidence, resilience and communication skills.

To boost creativity, why not try these simple ideas at home:

Open-ended play

- Offer junk modelling (boxes, tubes, bottle tops)
- Provide scarves, hats or bags for dressing up
- Let children decide what their creation will become

Create together

- Draw, paint or build alongside your child
- Let them lead while you follow their ideas

Value the process, not the product



- Focus on effort and imagination rather than how something looks
- Creative confidence comes once expectation is removed. “look at all of your interesting ideas!” “I wonder what this will become?”

Make mistakes welcome

- Celebrate trying again, doing things differently and learning as you go.
- Creativity grows when children feel safe to experiment

By supporting creativity at home and school, we are helping children build skills that will support them well beyond EYFS – thinking flexibly, sharing ideas and believing in themselves 🧡
