- **Reception and Rainbow Room** will enjoy a visit from the **Fire Service**,


- **Year 2** are off on an adventure to **Twycross Zoo**,

Attendance

Warnings and Sanctions

Our school will make use of the full range of potential sanctions – including, but not limited to, those listed below – to tackle poor attendance. Decisions will be made on an individual, case-by-case basis.

Notices to Improve

If the national threshold has been met and support is appropriate, but parents do not engage with offers of support, the school may offer a notice to improve to give parents a final chance to engage with support.

Notices to improve will be issued in line with processes set out in the local code of conduct for the local authority area in which the pupil attends school.

They will include:

- Details of the pupil's attendance record and of the offences
- The benefits of regular attendance and the duty of parents under [section 7 of the Education Act 1996](#)
- Details of the support provided so far
- Opportunities for further support, or to access previously provided support that was not engaged with
- A clear warning that a penalty notice may be issued if attendance doesn't improve within the improvement period, along with details of what sufficient improvement looks like, which will be decided on a case-by-case
- A clear timeframe of between 3 and 6 weeks for the improvement period

The grounds on which a penalty notice may be issued before the end of the improvement period.

Eating a Rainbow!

In the EYFS framework, children learn about looking after themselves, developing independence, and making choices that help them stay healthy. Talking about “eating a rainbow” is a fun way to help them notice how different fruits and vegetables help their bodies in different ways.



You might like to chat with your child at home about the colourful foods they enjoy. Can they spot something red, something green, something yellow on their plate? Even small conversations help build their understanding of health and self-care.
